Over the past five decades, Sightsavers has reached out to over **55 million** people with potential eye problems till date.

As of now, we work in 100 districts across 8 states of India bringing eye healthcare, educational support, counselling, training and leadership development to visually impaired people in some of the least served areas of the country.

We network with like-minded organisations to enable exchange of ideas and to advocate for the rights of the disabled. Sightsavers India has received the third edition of Grant Thornton Sabera 2020 Award in the "Shiksha" category for its effort in the field of education amidst the ongoing pandemic.

04 Sightsavers India and Standard Chartered join hands to prevent avoidable blindness in two major cities of Uttar Pradesh

Sightsavers with the support of Standard Chartered Bank launched the Urban Eye Health Programme also known as Amrita Drishti in Kanpur and Prayagraj of Uttar Pradesh. The intervention primarily focusses on increasing uptake of eye health services through setting up of vision centres in the slum communities, provisioning of eye health services as part of health systems and developing a favourable policy environment through engagement of urban local bodies. The Bank's participation is under the Seeing is Believing by Standard Chartered, a global initiative to tackle avoidable blindness and visual impairment.

05 Sightsavers, EU and EDF launch Rising Voices: A Paper on women with disabilities


Sightsavers, a global development organisation and European Disability Forum (EDF) are jointly implementing project 'Building Partnerships for Sustainable development Goals – Empowering Disabled People's Organisations' which is supported by European Union. The project supports people with disabilities to engage in, shape and monitor the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

06 Sightsavers India launches film on COVID Response on International Day of Persons with Disabilities

The film highlights the goal of Sightsavers during the pandemic, to ensure that people receive their income, food supplies, medical help, continuing education and psycho-social support to remain strong as they continue to fight the pandemic. It also brings forth the intervention with respect to online education for visually impaired children in Bihar known as Sankalp. A model of tele-education was adapted in 36 districts in Bihar which involves teaching children through the mobile telephonic network using calls to children through resource personnel. 


In this new normal, Sightsavers India will continue to work towards eliminating avoidable blindness and ensuring that persons with disabilities lead a life of independence and dignity.

I am proud of the entire team of Sightsavers India for working together to achieve our goals and make it what it is today. We hope to continue working dedicatedly and standing by our motto.







Rural Eye Health Programme

The objective of Rural Eye Health Programme is 'improving vision-related quality of life through strengthened eye health systems' with a focus on poor and deprived sections of the society. The year witnessed system strengthening amidst COVID-19 pandemic situation, service delivery, multi-level advocacy, partnerships development and evidence generation. With Netra Vasant, we seek to increase the Cataract Surgical Rate (CSR) in the selected districts in order to contribute to a reduction in the prevalence of blindness.



Key Highlights

- ▶ Frontline workers (ASHAs and Anganwadi workers) felicitated from intervention districts of Madhya Pradesh for their relentless efforts in creating awareness for eye care, educating the rural community, identifying and referring patients with different eye conditions to the vision centres and the outreach camps. On the occasion, around 500 front line workers along with 800 other women from the rural communities were screened and 150 were dispensed spectacles.
- ▶ Sightsavers' partners Urmul Khejari and CUTS in Rajasthan have started Door to Door (D2D) screening instead of outreach camps from June 2020 onwards. D2D teams go to pre-identified locations of a village designated to particular team. One team consists of two persons – Optometrist and Camp organiser/Coordinator. Team do screening, Refraction, provide glasses and medicine if required. They also refer patients who require surgeries to base hospital.
- ▶ The eye care practice set up in the Mahatma Gandhi Eye Hospital was changed in adherence to COVID regulations. The Ophthalmologists on PPE restricted their patient appointment by 50% at OPD and at OT. With such curtailments from Sightsavers' partner base hospital, the OPD elective patients along with screened patients from the villages, 68 number sight restoration surgeries were carried out in June out of which 70% were female beneficiaries.
- ▶ Fullerton India Credit Co. Ltd. (FICCL) supported Sightsavers started the Rural Eye Health Programme in REH programmes started in two new districts of Bihar- Araria and Sitamarhi, under which 2 vision centres have been established. The programme is by FICCL in the districts.
- ▶ Sightsavers launched the High Impact Rural Eye Health Programme in Hazaribagh district in March 2021.
- ▶ Sightsavers in association with Christian Fellowship organised door-to-door screening in Kanker and Kawardha, Chhattisgarh. The intervention was successful in gradual increase of screening numbers. In the month of July and August 1,255 persons were screened in these districts.
- ▶ Sightsavers in collaboration with the Health Department of Madhya Pradesh, organised "Kill Corona campaign" and initiated door-to-door awareness on COVID preventions along with eye care information in more than 500 villages of 8 districts in Madhya Pradesh.
- ▶ International Women's day was observed jointly with NRLM & Health Department in districts of Raisen, Rajgarh, Katni, Umaria, Jhabua, Alirajpur and Ashok Nagar, screenings were conducted for Corona warriors such as ASHA's, Anganwadi workers, community volunteers, Self-Help Group members and exclusively for women. In total 862 women were screened and 414 were provided with spectacles and 60 were identified & referred for cataract surgery. COVID warriors were felicitated for their hard work during COVID pandemic.
- ▶ NABH accreditation is a hallmark on quality of services and assures certain standards (Standards for patient care, medication management, consent process, patient safety). With the support of Sightsavers, Junagarh Netra Chikitsalaya, LEpra Society (PPP mode of Hospital) has been qualified for NABH entry level certification. This is a herculean task for qualifying for the NABH accreditation from a Hospital which is in the remote rural area of Kalahandi, Odisha. This is the first rural sub divisional hospital to get the certification in the state.

Chronicles from the field...

Seventy-year-old Sukhro is a member of an isolated tribe called the Toto residing in Totopara in the Alipurduar district of West Bengal, India. Totopara is a small enclave located at the foot of the Himalayas just to the south of the borderline between Bhutan and West Bengal.

Sukhro had bilateral mature cataract which prevented him from seeing for almost 19 years. His condition had taken a huge toll. With the intervention of Sightsavers, Sukhro got his eyes operated under the Rural Eye Health Programme. Sukhro enjoyed every aspect of the treatment because he knew it would lead to him having his vision restored. When Sightsavers team met Sukhro in December 2020, they were amazed to find him making 'Tukri', a basket made from bamboo. The transformation in Sukhro's life was a delight for everyone.

Urban Eye Health Programme

Amrita Drishti - Urban Eye Health Programme (UEHP) focuses on eye health of urban poor living in slums and aims at establishing system of primary eye care through community resource building and strengthening National Health Mission (NHM).

Key Highlights

- ▶ Director of Sightsavers partner hospital in U.P. Vanshidhar Chikaska Seva Sanasthan, Dr Sharad Bajpayee awarded COVID19 Warrior by the U.P governor honourable Anandiben Patel. This award was given because of door-to-door screening services provided by the partner under the Sightsavers Urban Eye Health Programme during COVID 19.
- ▶ Sightsavers in association with the Government of West Bengal launched Universal Eye Health - Chokher Alo in the state. The inauguration of the programme was done by West Bengal's Honourable Chief Minister, Ms Mamta Banerjee at Nabanna. The goal of the programme is to strengthen the efforts to prevent avoidable blindness in West Bengal and provide equitable health services to all citizens of the state.
- ▶ Sightsavers entered into partnership with SCB for Urban Eye Health Programme in the slums of Kanpur, Prayagraj and Varanasi of Uttar Pradesh.
- ▶ Sightsavers in association with Women & Child welfare department Madhya Pradesh initiated eye screenings at Anganwadi Centres (AWCs): An Eye Care Outreach initiative in COVID-19: The COVID-19 pandemic is having a devastating impact on people, communities, and economies, including health care and eye care. It has brought enormous challenges to health care system. To address this issue, Sightsavers along with partner adopted the strategy to integrate with the AWCs as an accessible place in the slum and the vulnerable groups like women

and children are familiar with it. Thorough this strategy, it is ensured to reach to the vulnerable and weaker sections/ group (women, children, adolescents, senior citizens, etc.) and cover peripheral slums of the city, where reach of eye care facilities are negligible. During the quarter 103 AWCs have been covered reaching out to 7640 slum dwellers. 58% of them are females and 282 have been referred to base hospital for cataract surgery.

- ▶ Sightsavers' eye health camps have been integrated in the regular health camps by the Government of Rajasthan.
- ▶ Sightsavers' Urban Eye Health Programme in Bihar was felicitated with ICC Social Impact Award from Indian Chamber of Commerce in the Large Project Category.

Chronicles from the field...

Bhanwar Kanwar has been an Anganwadi helper for over 16 years in an Anganwadi Centre in Jaipur, Rajasthan. Furthermore, she is a member of Mahila Arogya Samiti (MAS).

Bhanwar, along with her husband, was identified with cataract under Sightsavers' Urban Eye Health Programme. Thereafter, the couple went through cataract surgery at Sightsavers' partner hospital in Jaipur.

Bhanwar is a leader in her own right. She is hard working and completely dedicated to her work. Being an Anganwadi helper and a MAS member at 65, Bhanwar has received lot of attention and support from people in her locality.

VIDYA JYOTI

National School Eye Health Programme

Vidya Jyoti - National School Eye Health programme aims to screen children in Government school to identify and prevent eye diseases and vision impairments among children that affect learning outcomes.

Key Highlights

- ▶ A webinar on “Post COVID do’s and don’ts of Eye screening in schools” was organised by Sightsavers by a renowned speaker Dr. Asim Sil, Medical Director, Vivekananda Mission Asram Netra Niramay Niketan (VMANNN), West Bengal where 70 participants belonging to different groups like project coordinators, optometrists, vision technicians, health educators and Sightsavers staff across Sightsavers School eye health implementation states attended the webinar.
- ▶ Sightsavers’ School Eye Health programme in the Kalahandi district continued by adopting screening at both school and community level.

RAAHI

National Truckers

Eye Health Programme

Sightsavers realises the importance of eye health for the overworked truckers' community in ensuring road safety. Since drivers can't get to eye care services, Sightsavers in India have created a system which takes the services directly to them. RAAHI is one of the biggest eye health programmes in the country for the overworked truck drivers' community.

Key Highlights



- ▶ During Road Safety week, Sightsavers in collaboration with Jhabua police, organised special camps and screened for occupational drivers in Madhya Pradesh.
- ▶ March 2020 until September 2020, RAAHI vision centres were not functional due to multiple lockdowns during COVID-19 pandemic. Jamshedpur, in Jharkhand was the first centre to resume services in October 2020 for truck drivers keeping in mind the COVID-19 protocols.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

The Inclusive Education Programme is implemented in five states. The programme prioritises technical support to Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) for training and capacity building of general teachers to address education needs of the Children with Disabilities (CWDs) with special focus on children with visual impairment. The programme aims to demonstrate scalable approaches to strengthen systems and build a cogent institutional response. The thematic focus of the programme is to expedite quality of learning outcomes for the CWDs and secure enablement through teacher training, information and communications technology (ICT) promotion, technical, infrastructural and community support.

Key Highlights

- ▶ UDYAM* scaled up in Odisha - The module “UDYAM” designed by Sightsavers Odisha was supported by SCERT & School & Mass Education Department to assist teachers who want to ensure that the children with disabilities receive quality education in an inclusive setting. Sightsavers with the support of Odisha School Education Programme Authority (OSEPA), Odisha, conducted two batches of training program for teachers and resource persons. Five-day training programmes were organised by respective District Office, Samagra Sikshya in 28 out of the 30 districts of the state.
- ▶ Sightsavers in West Bengal, Bihar, Odisha & Jharkhand initiated Online education of children with visual impairment to ensure that the children get access to education as they are promoted to new classes during this time of the year. In Jharkhand total 218 children were provided training at online platform. On the other hand, in Bihar, this approach has been piloted and tested for its efficacy by Sightsavers and later on scaled-up by the Government of Bihar across the State for all children with visual impairment with the support of Government staff/teachers.

- ▶ During the lockdown period, Odisha Team has stressed more on advocacy efforts as field-related activities were restricted. Number of telephonic/web-based discussions were made with the state Inclusive Education team of Odisha Primary Education Programme Authority (OPEPA) regarding inclusion of inclusive education related activities in annual Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) for this year. As a result, the government has agreed to include activities like Low vision assessment and support of ICT devices for visually impaired children in all districts in the annual PIP.

*Udyam Registration, also called MSME Registration, is a government registration for MSMEs providing them with a unique Identity Number and a recognition certificate, to certify them as (remove “a”) micro/small/medium enterprises.

▶ In Madhya Pradesh, Sightsavers jointly with National Institute of Empowering People with Visual Impairment (NIEPVD) developed a guideline on creating Inclusive online learning contents for content developers and shared with Rajya Shiksha Kendra (RSK). With this initiative, the course materials will benefit to 103,413 CWSN including 15,814 visually impaired children in the State.

▶ Sightsavers demonstrated & developed Model Inclusive Radio script in Madhya Pradesh. Sightsavers collected radio programmes from RSK which were already broadcasted and analysed it with visually impaired (VI) child's learning viewpoint. This task was done in collaboration with NIEPVD.

▶ Sightsavers has developed two self-learning modules on IE & Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) for teachers and shared with Government of Madhya Pradesh to be uploaded on government's Diksha Portal benefitting around 3 lakh teachers of the State who will get self-trained & certified. Both the modules will be adopted by RSK to include in their training portals.

▶ In Rajasthan, a three-day online teacher's training on inclusive pedagogies was organised by Sightsavers for government schoolteachers. Approximately 100 government teachers participated in the online training. The training covered a range of topics such as CRPD, SDG 4, legal provisions for children with disabilities and RPWD Act, types of disabilities, educational model for children with disabilities, concept of inclusive education, identification of CVIs and classification, learning methods of CVIs, plus curriculum, principle of curriculum adaptation.

▶ Apart from the tele-education programme under IE project in Jharkhand, Sightsavers in association with Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) conducted ICT based skill training for children with visual impairment in Hazaribag, Dumka, Deoghar and Jamtara Districts of Jharkhand.

Portraits From The Front Lines...

Eleven year old **Vibha** studies in a government school for economically weaker sections in Jehanabad, Bihar. Vibha is visually impaired since birth and is supported by Sightsavers under its Inclusive Education Programme. Vibha has been trained and provided with accessible devices which assist her in studies.

After signing the MoU with the Government of Bihar, Sightsavers is allocating all kinds of accessible devices required by children with visual impairment for educational, recreational and mobility purposes in the government schools of the state.

As far as first impressions go, Vibha comes across as shy and an introvert. But when faced with a mathematical challenge, her shyness quickly evaporates. While she might be just another 11-year-old going through the rigmaroles of middle school, her teachers feel that Vibha has mathematical aptitude way beyond her years.

Maths is my favourite subject. My friends and classmates always come to me for help if they find any difficulty in solving a math equation. In future, I see myself teaching this subject in big colleges and universities.



SOCIAL INCLUSION

To enable social inclusion of people with disabilities, Sightsavers has concentrated its focus around three core areas: economic empowerment, strengthening Organisations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs) and creating an enabling environment. Sightsavers thus supports people with disability through livelihood interventions and facilitates the formation and capacity building of DPOs to carry out effective advocacy for their rights on all platforms and levels.

Key Highlights

- ▶ Organisations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs) supported by Sightsavers were able to get the following suggestions incorporated by The Election Commission of India:
 - Voter IDs of person with disability will be made accessible to Persons with severe visual impairment and blindness
 - The physical information provided to the visually impaired during the election campaign will be braille enabled
 - Visually impaired will be allowed to cast vote through postal order which was earlier applicable only government employees
- ▶ Amidst the pandemic, women with disabilities supported by Sightsavers have been providing masks to those in need. With support from the government of Rajasthan, they are running three food canteens in the city of Chittaurgarh.
- ▶ Members of Disabled People's Organisations supported by Sightsavers organised POSHAN month in Sultanpur. The activities in POSHAN month focussed on Social Behavioural Change and Communication (SBCC).

▶ MoU between Sightsavers India and West Bengal State Rural Livelihood Mission was renewed and extended for another year in the month of July till June 2021. Along with the extension of time, another 5 new blocks were included in the MoU where Sightsavers will play a technical support role in strengthening persons with disabilities.

▶ The Disabled People Organisations (DPOs) supported by Sightsavers in Primary States like Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Odisha, were engaged in providing support to the severely disabled persons. They are supplying food materials and other required household items. DPOs have also taken the responsibility to telephonically call persons with disabilities and provide required information regarding the preventive measures on COVID-19.

▶ Impact of lockdown on Women with Disabilities: Sightsavers in collaboration with Rising Flame undertook a short-term project to understand the situation of women with disabilities during COVID lockdown.

Portraits From The Front Lines...

Savita is 24 years old and has physical disability. She comes from a remote village in Chhattisgarh, India. Savita had always wanted to study and after graduating from college, she turned her focus towards working for the rights of people with disabilities. In 2019, Savita joined a Disabled People's Organisation (DPO), supported by Sightsavers, where she was elected as the Group's President.

Savita's efforts during the COVID-19 crisis have been amazing. She has been making cloth masks for people in need of protection from the pandemic. Savita has donated one month of her disability pension to the StateCOVID-19 relief fund. She has been working with other DPO leaders to provide financial assistance to people with serious and multiple disabilities in her region amidst the lockdown. RN Mohanty on how the sight-impaired in India are affected by the pandemic

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to rage across the world, people from all walks of life, including the disabled, are gravely impacted by the new normal. We speak to RN Mohanty, CEO of Sightsavers in India, on the kind of impact the pandemic has had on the sight-impaired in India.

How did Sightsavers begin? What was the mission then, and how it changed since?

After being founded in 1971, the John W. Alden Eye Center began to establish a long-term vision care program for people with visual impairments. The program has evolved to include a wide range of services, including low vision, orientation and mobility, and braille. Today, Sightsavers is a global organization with a mission to help people with visual impairments live better lives.

How are the facilities for the sight-impaired in India, especially compared to other countries?

India is home to a billion people, but the facilities for the sight-impaired are often inadequate. There is a lack of accessible public transport, and many people with visual impairments face significant challenges in their daily lives. Sightsavers is working to address these challenges through various programs, including training and support services.

How can the authorities help improve conditions for the sight-impaired in the pandemic?

Authorities can play a crucial role in supporting people with visual impairments during the pandemic. This includes ensuring that public transport is accessible and safe, and providing support services for people who are unable to work or attend school. Sightsavers is advocating for these measures to be implemented.






Income FY 20-21


